**Scripture Reading:** Luke 13: 18-21 *The Parable of the Mustard Seed/ The Parable of the Yeast* 

<sup>18</sup>He said therefore, "What is the kingdom of God like? And to what should I compare it? <sup>19</sup>It is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in the garden; it grew and became a tree, and the birds of the air made nests in its branches." <sup>20</sup>And again he said, "To what should I compare the kingdom of God? <sup>21</sup>It is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened."

- <sup>2</sup> a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot.
- <sup>3</sup> a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build,
- <sup>4</sup> a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance,
- <sup>5</sup> a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing,
- <sup>6</sup> a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away,
- <sup>7</sup> a time to tear and a time to mend,
  - a time to be silent and a time to speak,
- <sup>3</sup> a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.

Seasons in life means that change it on its way. Change also happens as a tiny mustard seed grows into a large bush and as yeast transforms batter into dough for bread. Change happens. They say the one constant in life is change.

Aging is a process of change. From the day we are born our body begin that process and it does not end until we pass from this life. Change can be exciting. Think of being young when you went for post secondary education or got your first job. For many marriage and babies were the next changes. Parent watch as children grow and mature. I enjoyed every stage of parenthood and that continues even now, but it has meant a change in the relationship with my children as they too have grown and matured.

When I meet with couples intending to marry, we always talk about the fact that the marriage relationship will change. If it doesn't change it means that it is not maturing and a stagnant relationship will not last.

For others, they have focused on careers, but no job stays exactly the same. Co-workers change, for some mechanization and the digital world have completely transformed their work environment. Over time there will always be something new to learn.

I often look to learn one new thing each day. Just by learning one more thing, I cannot stay the same.

Our world has changed, even for those who have grown up in Thunder Bay they do not experience the city as they did when they were young. For starters 50 years ago the two cities became one. When you were young you would not have imaged that could happen.

We change, we grow, we mature, we learn. If God has been important to us our faith must also grow and change. If you believe and understand God today as you did when you were even 25 years old, that is not a good thing. Your core understanding may be the same, though even that can change, but if your relationship with God is dynamic then you will have a deeper understanding of grief, loss, hope, forgiveness, love, and grace. This is one of the beautiful things about aging. Done well, there is wisdom, time to ponder, to think before one acts, to understand more readily why people are who they are even when they are not making the best choices.

To be a Christian means to desire change and to be willing to be a part of change. We are called to change the world, to let others know about God, to act for others in speaking out for justice, and getting past our fears to be able to share our God given gifts, show mercy, and love broadly.

As we head into Lent and this time looking at change, may you allow God to make needed changes in you in order to have a deeper relationship with God and live a life that more fully reflects Christ's example of forgiveness, love, and grace.

Lord, we give you thanks for the word that you hide like a treasure in our heart, for the leaven which is able to penetrate to every area of our life - for the seed that is able to grow into a mighty plant.
