World Humanitarian Day (August 19)

Ravaged by almost three decades of conflict as well as recurrent droughts, Somalia's population suffers from chronic food insecurity. Lacking access to basic necessities, many are vulnerable to disease and malnutrition. In response, Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D) and Canadian Foodgrains Bank are providing vital humanitarian assistance to those in need. Pregnant and lactating women, as well as children under five, are being screened for malnutrition and receiving supplementary feeding. Additionally, the project is empowering vulnerable women with lessons about how to prevent further malnutrition, eat a balanced diet and maintain nutrition, providing them with the tools and

I feel like I keep writing about the same things these past few months, only using a slightly different angle to describe the varying tangle of emotions I am experiencing. I share these things

in hopes that it will normalize some of what you may be experiencing. There is much to be thankful for in my life and family. So far, my family has been very fortunate in terms of employment and health, so it always seems a little odd that there is also a tinge of sadness in so many moments. No matter the external influences of living in a time of social distancing and a pandemic, we still have to go through the emotions that we might normally be experiencing and add the layers that have robbed us of the normal supports we have come to rely on. Today would have been my mom's birthday, so there is sadness in my mourning and gratitude for her life. As well, Ken and I were supposed to be with my dad in Alberta and visiting our sons, daughters in law, siblings and extended family. It has been some time since I have seen any of them. I am thankful for video calls that help me feel like I am seeing them, but nothing replaces their hugs. All of this has left me with a few tears to shed. I don't know when I will be able to see them again. We have our fingers crossed for time after Christmas in AB but no one is booking flights at this time.

And yet...we are grateful and there is joy, and there is laughter, there are backyard visits with friends, phone calls, and there is hope. I don't hold all of this too tightly; I give it to God. I give the challenging moments over to God knowing that I still have to live through them, but I don't have to do it alone. I give the joy and gratitude to God, knowing that God is also with me when I am rejoicing and thankful. It helps to balance out the emotions and lessen any burden knowing that God's got me. In tears and laughter, sorrow and joy, and all the in-between - God's got me, God's got this. It is a promise for me and it is a promise for you.
