### From Joyce

Today is Remembrance Sunday. It is the last of three Sundays in a row in which we remember. The first was Reformation Sunday when we reflect on the history of the church and what it means for us today to be a reformed and reforming church. Last Sunday was All Saints Sunday. We marked the occasion with lighting candles to remember first, those who have died in this past year, then candles to honour all those who have guided us in our faith and lives, both as individuals and as a church. Today, the Sunday before Remembrance Day, we stop also to honour and remember the men and women who have served, and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict and peace. At this time, the moment to remember in our church is even more important as commemorative events have been severely scaled back and the public has been asked to observe the actual Remembrance Day from home. Though war is not something that anyone wants, it is always important for all Christians to fight for a just and equitable society, one where every life is considered valuable. We always hope that the fight will be one where people can sit together, have conversations, come up with solutions that consider those with the biggest disadvantages physically, economically, socially, mentally, and spiritually. Sadly, human nature does not always allow for that. Too many leaders vie for power and wealth and it is those who have the least that suffer the most. Today we honour all people with the courage, knowledge, and training to act when the threat is high, human dignity and life is at stake, and words are not enough.
