I receive your promises today in faith and confidence. I cast all my cares on you and set my heart on you today in Jesus name, Amen



Hygiene Kits Protect Families in Nicaragua

"As a family, we try to take all the necessary measures, like covering our nose when sneezing, avoiding shaking hands or going places where there might be large crowds. For many of the families in our community, it's not possible to acquire protection materials like face masks, gloves, hand sanitizer or cleaning materials due to rising prices in the market. We are so thankful for all of you and the help you bring to our community." Like many in Nicaragua, María struggles to access proper protection materials and cleaning products due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Presbyterian World Service & Development, through local partners, is helping people like María and her whole community, receive hygiene and sanitation items, ensuring they are prepared to safely face the pandemic.

It dawned on me as I prepared to write this email that it would be important to share news with you of our sister church

First Presbyterian, Thunder Bay. First Presbyterian is facing severe financial challenges exacerbated by Covid. First Pres., St. Andrew's, and churches across the country, are faced with the realities that have come with months of closures as well as limited capacities at worship when we were allowed to be open for worship. There is also the fact that many people are staying home even when they can worship in person because they are protecting themselves. This is an important and reasonable choice for anyone in these times and especially when people are into their senior years or are vulnerable due to other health concerns.

Media has covered the challenges of businesses and individuals, even some organizations in the last year, but the fact is the pandemic has made staying viable difficult for worshiping communities as well. At St. Andrew's we are deeply thankful that offerings (donations, financial gifts) to the church actually exceeded our budgeted expectations last year. Still, the lack of fundraising left us in a deficit position at the end of 2020. Thankfully we have a bit of a buffer in order to manage that deficit. Our community of faith has been amazing in their support of the ministry, staff, and work of the church. To get through 2021 we will continue to be relying on the abundant generosity of the congregation and others to help us continue to do the work we are doing and maybe even make plans for what can yet be done to bring the love, iov, hope, and grace that is the gospel to people in new and dynamic ways.

As for First Presbyterian, today they are saying goodbye to their minister Rev. Susan Mattinson as they can no longer afford to support full time ordained ministry. Because of the pandemic they cannot even say goodbye to her in person. They are heart-broken. Susan will be posting her final Sunday devotional service on their church website and Facebook page February 28 should you like to check out her message. First Pres. will continue to discern a way forward to see what God is calling them to do and how to do it. We hold Rev. Susan, her husband Colin, and the entire congregation of First Presbyterian in our prayers extending our love and concern. May God bless their future.
