Camping from Home

For many children, Camp Douglas in British Columbia is their safe space away from home. These young campers have little to no connection with a congregation or other Christian community outside of camp. They come each summer with a hunger for God and a desire to reunite with the loving Christian community they experienced in past summers. Last year, Camp Douglas staff adapted the camp's programming using an online platform that enabled their important ministry to continue throughout the summer. Staff ran weekly Bible studies and campfires, as well as other traditional camp activities that could be done at home. Camp Douglas was able to provide this wonderful experience in part through regional resourcing grants, supported by Presbyterians Sharing.

HONOURING THE CHILDREN: RECONCILIATION AND RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS FUND ESTABLISHED

In response to the devastating confirmation of unmarked graves on the grounds of former residential schools, and in honour of the children who were lost and all people living with the consequences of that legacy, The Presbyterian Church in Canada has established the *Honouring the Children: Reconciliation and Residential Schools Fund*. This fund will support initiatives associated with searches for unmarked burial sites in communities where schools were operated by The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

All work will complement efforts to address systemic racism against Indigenous people, both in the church and Canadian society, and the ongoing healing and reconciliation work being done in the ministries of the National Indigenous Ministry Council.

To begin, the church has committed \$1 million from national funds, and invites congregations and individuals to make additional contributions to this important work.

Sympathy, Empathy and Compassion; Our Calling as Christians

Sympathy, empathy and compassion. We hear the words used all the time. We might use them interchangeably, but, are they the same?

According to Sara Schairer, sympathy is the ability to understand someone's feels. You can imagine why someone feels happy or sad, even if you have never been in their particular situation. For example, you can understand why someone might feel sad at the loss of a loved one, even though you have never lost someone close to you at this point in your life, or why someone is happy at the birth of a grandchild, even though you don't have any grandchildren yourself.

Empathy is feeling what another person is feeling. For example, if a person has lost a loved one, you feel their pain deeply within yourself, and are sad too. You don't just understand their feelings, you experience them yourself.

Compassion takes things one step further. You not only recognize a person's feelings, (sympathize) or feel their feelings (empathize), you are compelled to act; to do something to alleviate a person's suffering. A person's pain at the loss of a loved one might spur you to make a meal to bring over, or to visit them and be present with them in their suffering.

As Christians, we are called beyond sympathy and empathy to compassion; Christ has no hands in this world but ours. By turning our thoughts and feelings into actions, Christ's light can shine on others through us.
