NEW BEGINNINGS

St. Andrew's has been accepted into the New Beginnings program of the PCC. This is the breakdown of program that the church will be participating in. We ask that you hold our ministry, leadership, and congregation in prayer as we prepare for this time of discernment, hope, and discovery.

- 1. **Assessment** of the current ministry of the church, celebration of the way God has been present and is present with the congregation and a realistic identification of potential future steps.
- 2. **Workshops** to help the congregation understand the changes in spiritual practices in this new era and why many elements of current ministry structures no longer work.
- 3. **House Meetings** to open yourselves to new ways of thinking about mission and to make a bold decision for the future.
- 4. **Coaching** to help implement your future story." We will be assigned a specially trained assessor and coach to guide us through the process. All those trained to be assessors and coaches are ministers of the PCC.

An Education for Robina

Robina lives with her mother, father and five siblings in a make-shift house in Afghanistan. Both of her parents are unemployed, and Robina is the only member of her family attending school. In Afghanistan, 62 percent of children do not attend school. Often, families with many children cannot afford uniforms and school supplies for each child. Girls are especially disadvantaged because of a shared cultural belief that if girls study, they bring shame on their families. Only one in five students in Afghan schools are female, and only about one in 10 adult women are literate. Presbyterian World



Service & Development (PWS&D) is passionate about ensuring a world in which all children can access quality education. Working with local partners, PWS&D helps parents and religious leaders understand girls' rights—most importantly, the right to education.

Today is our first Sunday since December 20th that we have been able to worship in person and I am grateful to be present with those who are in the sanctuary but also those who continue to worship online. Our church community has expanded. We are now able to reach those who cannot come to church but have access to services online. Our services have also been shared with the congregation of St. Andrew's and St. James' Shared ministry in Geraldton and, since March, with First Presbyterian as both are without ministers and I am the interim moderator for those congregations. Beyond that, the online services are being accessed by people throughout Canada who have discovered us and a few who happen to be related to me, so our online presence will continue.

There is another piece that is really important right now and that is the New Beginnings program of the Presbyterian Church in Canada and our being accepted into the program. There has been a fair bit of "behind the scenes" work being done to prepare for our start in the program. The date that is really important is Tuesday October 5th at 7:00pm. As part of the program an *Appreciative Inquiry Session* will take place with Rev. Ken MacQuarrie. Ken is a minister of the PCC and has received training to guide us over the next year as we work together to see where God is leading the congregation of St. Andrew's at this point in our church life. Ken actually knows a little something about St. Andrew's as his wife Shaunna, originally from Ft. Francis, was a youth group leader for a short time at the church when Bert was minister here. There will be much more to say about New Beginnings as it will be a major part of our focus in the months to come. May God go before us preparing the way.
