SHORTBREAD IS BACK

While Covid is still too prevalent to hold the Tea and Bazaar as we know it, shortbread will be available again this year. Last year's shortbread fundraiser was a resounding success, raising in the range of \$7000 in a difficult financial year. We are counting on this very important source of revenue again this year to meet out budget. We have purchased butter and it is available to volunteer bakers. Baking has begun and will continue throughout November. All bakers are asked to pick up an instruction sheet from the office. This includes the recipe and important details so we can provide the consistent product our buyers have come to expect. We can also loan you cookie cutters if you need them. Please call Sue Heald at 621-2226 or Kathie Pawlik at 344-4635 to volunteer to bake. We are also very short of cookie tins as we used

everything we had last year. Please ask family and friends for unused tins and keep an eye out at second hand places for tins in good condition with no rust inside.



SHORTBREAD BAKERS

Many bakers make light work. For 200 lbs of butter, 10 bakers means 20 lbs of butter each. If we can get 20 bakers, that's only 10 lbs each. Some will make more and some less. We appreciate whatever amount of baking you can do. All baked shortbread should be packed in plastic bags in boxes or in cookie tins or airtight containers of some sort. If you want your container back, please label it. It will be kept frozen until it is packed by a separate group. All shortbread can be dropped off at the church during office hours or by arrangement.

BUTTER

Shortbread bakers can pick up butter as needed from the church. All butter taken from the freezer

downstairs needs to be recorded on the sheet on top of the freezer. All butter can be picked up at the church during office hours or by arrangement.

Tuesday evening, we had our much-anticipated Appreciative Inquiry Evening with Rev. Ken MacQuarrie, the Hope Assessor assigned to our congregation as part of the New Beginnings process. Ken spent the afternoon touring the building and property with me, then met with our Accountant Shelly Macaulay and Bookkeeper Barb Silvey, as well as getting a "windshield" tour of the city with John Mason. After dinner with John and myself, it was back to the church for the hybrid meeting. Thank you to all who joined in person and online for the meeting. The number of people in attendance and the responses to the questions were a hopeful indicator of the desire for meaningful engagement with the community while also continuing our worship and growing sense of caring family of faith.

So next steps...Phase 3 of the process is Ken will take all the information that has been provided to him previously and throughout the day last week and will complete a comprehensive Assessment Report. This report will serve as the base document from which the rest of the New Beginnings process will unfold. In this report Ken will reflect on the church's assets, current programming, context and potential future directions. The report will include:

- Our congregation's demographics.
- A pin map showing the location of our membership
- Our community demographics and neighborhood trends
- Financial history and analysis
- Building condition and usage
- Ministry activities and metrics of our congregation's vitality
- Three narrative that suggest future directions for our congregation.

It usually takes three to four weeks for the Hope Assessor to produce the report. The congregation will be given the report during the small group process which is yet to come. As a Session we were advised that from start to the follow through of the process we are looking at a year. So, thank you for your engagement thus far and know there is much yet to come.

PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY

As the Covid -19 pandemic evolves into a fourth wave, St Andrew's will continue as much as possible to provide a safe space for all who enter by following the recommendations and guidelines of the Health Unit.


MISSION & OUTREACH FOOD BANK
