What are you waiting for? I have been sitting with that question for a while. I watch as people wait for news about an engagement or the birth of a child. It might be one has waited for news about which college or university they have been accepted to, or whether or not they have landed the job they applied for. Some wait for a diagnosis about their health and wellness, while others wait by bed sides as a loved one hangs on before taking their last breath. I watch as little ones wait for parents who are busy talking or shopping, and parents as they wait for children to put on their clothes or have their breakfast. I watch as care givers watch elderly parents get in and out of vehicles and walk to their place of residence and I watch as the elderly wait for family or friends to visit.
