BAKERS & BUTTER

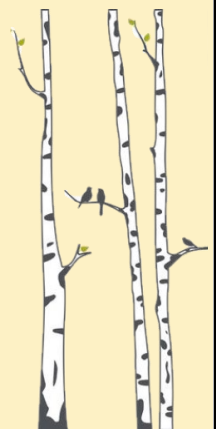

From Joyce

Today, with Reign of Christ Sunday, we mark the closing of the Christian calendar for this year. Next week we begin a new year with the first Sunday of Advent. Our worship in this Season of Advent is based on a series entitled, *What Are You Waiting For?* Advent is always considered a time of waiting. Those wonderful chocolate Advent calendars that you see in every store right now are a way of counting the days to Christmas, of anticipating the days until we once again celebrate the birth of Christ. In church we light the candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love each Sunday as we prepare for Christmas Eve/Christmas Day. In our lives we are waiting for the end of the pandemic and the end of Covid protocols. We are waiting for time to be with family over the holidays, waiting for the next cheque to tie us over the month or to sustain our living. We wait at the bedside of someone we love that has only hours, days, or months to live. As a congregation we are waiting to see what will come out of the New Beginnings program, waiting for the next phase and the report of the Assessor. As the hymn says, "All earth is waiting." But as Christians we do not sit passively and wait; we actively wait for the coming of Christ again and again. Not because it is ritual, but because it is about our faith growing, maturing, deepening and learning to trust. We wait in peace and in strength as we anticipate being satisfied by the work of Jesus Christ in our lives through the power of the Holy Spirit. Prepare your hearts for this time of Advent. Attempt to slow yourself in order to watch, wait, and listen actively for the coming of Christ in Advent, in Christmas, and on this day when we celebrate the reign of Christ in our hearts.

Protecting Children in Malawi

Ten-year-old Joseph lives with his family in northern Malawi. One day, Joseph showed up to school, not quite himself. His friends noticed and asked what was wrong. "My father and mother shout at each other and fight almost every week. Sometimes my father calls us bad names and chases us out of the house at night, for no reason," he said. His friends, who had learned about children's rights and what support was available to them, urged him to speak to a Child Protection Worker.

The Child Protection Worker understood the economic challenges that were exacerbating the abuse and connected the family with resources to address them. Together, the family is using what they have learned to build a more peaceful home. This project is supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development.
