I have been blessed to be surrounded by what I call "The Best Session in Canada!" and a congregation that parallels that. Throughout the year the Session and Facilities & Finance team have been consistently, diligently, and compassionately, taking on the leadership that has been necessary whether the building was closed or open for worship and work. Our staff of Jamie, Rebecca, Sheila, Barb, and Shaundra have all gone above and beyond for us and particularly for me. The stability and strength of this congregation, leadership, and staff, has allowed me to minister to other congregations in the presbytery, and through me show our care and concern for our sister churches. Mission and Outreach has also been very active and because of their initiatives as a congregation we have continued to be able to reach out beyond our doors to help other important organizations in Thunder Bay and elsewhere.
