At the Time of Mr. Rowand's induction there were no elders in the church, and so for the time being an Interim Session was appointed by the Presbytery. In due time, however, the congregation elected Doctor T. S. T. Smellie and Angus McDonald who, after being duly inducted, comprised, together with the minister, the first Session of St. Andrew's.

Next week, Sunday July 17th, we will be blessing prayer shawls as part of the worship service. This happens a few times a year as shawls are knitted and become available for giving to others. We are so blessed to have a number of people who participate as part of the Prayer Shawl Ministry. Each person shares gifts of time and craftsmanship to create the shawls. Anyone can request a shawl from the prayer shawl ministry team in a number of ways...you can connect with the office, with Terry Wainwright, or with me to request a shawl. These shawls are most often given to people who are bereaved, ill, or struggling in some way, but these need not be the only reasons that someone receives a shawl. It may be a move to a new community, a move into Thunder Bay from elsewhere, another kind of transition, or anyway that you think a shawl may bring comfort and reassurance to another.

Each shawl is lovingly crafted using a particular type of wool that is gentle and comforting. Wool is provided to the knitters and is purchased through donations made to this particular ministry. If you would like to donate to the Prayer Shawl ministry fund you can do so in the same ways any offering can be received, just earmark or send a note to let us know where to designate the donation. Check out the information on offerings elsewhere in the newsletter to see the various ways you can donate to the church. Each shawl also has a special tag sewn on to let people know that it's from St. Andrew's. When given away, the shawls are wrapped in tissue and placed in a gift bag with a special card enclosed.

Should you wish to join the group of knitters or want to get more information, again you can contact the office, myself, or Terry Wainwright. What is nice is, this ministry can be done in your own home and contribute with great benefit and compassion to the ministry of the congregation as a whole. Once again, thank you to the knitters who make this outreach possible to people both in the congregation and the community, and at times beyond Thunder Bay.
