PCC MISSION MOMENTS

Millions of people are in need of humanitarian assistance due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Larysa, her husband and her daughter escaped Kharkiv after spending four nights in the basement of their home due to bombings in the city. "Everyone wanted to travel out of Kharkiv. There were many people at the train station,"

shared Larysa. The family found shelter in a refugee centre supported by the ACT Alliance. "We are happy to have a place to sleep and where it is warm. It is safe here. I am glad our children are alive." Presbyterian World Service & Development



is supporting Hungarian Interchurch Aid with an appeal issued by the ACT Alliance to provide emergency food assistance, essential non-food aid, health care and emotional support to refugees and internally displaced people.

ST. ANDREW'S HISTORY

Taken from: History of Presbyterianism in Thunder Bay and District (1869-1980) *Harcourt T. Johnston*

Mr. Fraser was succeeded by the Reverend J.L. Simpson in November, 1889 (the story of his induction has already been related) and like his predecessor, served both St. Andrew's and First Church for a period of time, possibly up to the beginning of the 1890's when, although he continued to exercise oversight over First Church, became to all intents and purposed the minister of St. Andrew's alone. With this change the story of St. Andrew's as a congregation in its own right begins.

Mr. Simpson's pastorate, although brief, was a pastorate during which several new organizations saw the light of day. Mrs. Simpson organized the first Women's Missionary Society in the congregation and was elected its first president. As well, Mr. Simpson himself organized the first Young People's Society of Christian Endeavour in the church. Then too, St. Andrew's Sunday School was completely reorganized and put under the care of very efficient and devoted teachers.

The chairman of the Board of Management during Mr. Simpson's time was Mr. T. A. Bell, while the organist and choir leader was Miss May McLaurin.

Mr. Simpson concluded his patorate in St. Andrew's during 1893 and was succeeded by Reverend W. L. H. Rowand who was inducted in October of that same year.
