#### **PCC MISSION MOMENTS**

When the Taliban took control of Afghanistan in August 2021, an atmosphere of uncertainty prevailed. Among the many issues that have surfaced since the Taliban takeover are rapidly spreading hunger and restrictions to education. International sanctions on the Taliban make it challenging to provide assistance in Afghanistan. When possible, Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D) provides emergency food assistance with the support of other members of Canadian Foodgrains Bank. PWS&D's partner in Afghanistan has also established 12 education centres to safely support students while restrictions on education are in place.

#### **NEW BEGINNINGS PROGRAM UPDATE**

Though it may seem that things have been quiet on the New Beginnings front, we have actually moved into Phase Six of the program which is a time of discernment and decision making. Our small group facilitators have been meeting together to share their information and to discern the underlying themes and directions that came through during the small group meetings. The facilitators have gathered the comments into a report which will be shared with the congregation the last week of August.

With that all in place, the date of **Thursday**September 29 at 7:00pm in the Sanctuary has been set for a **Congregational Information**Session. At this meeting the congregation is given an opportunity to identify priorities from within the report and affirm a future direction for the congregation. At this stage the congregation receives the report and sends it to the session to develop an action plan. Please plan to attend either by Zoom or in person this very important time of working toward a future story for St. Andrew's.

#### SHORTBREAD SEASON

Shortbread time is fast approaching and the search for inexpensive salted butter is underway. Butter seems to be \$6 a pound or more this year. We need your help again in amassing 200 lbs of salted butter as cheaply as possible. If you find butter on sale, please pick up the maximum allowed. The butter can be brought to the church for storage and the receipt submitted for reimbursement. You could also approach the store manager and explain it is for a church fundraiser and often they will let you



have more that the limit. If there is no limit, consider picking up a case (50 lbs). Anything under \$5/lb is a good buy, but it would be great if we can find it for even less than that.
