The Respite Ministry of St. Columba—a parish of the Presbyterian Church of Mauritius—supports families who care for people with intellectual and physical challenges by giving guardians and family members an opportunity to have a break while trained volunteers help take care of their children or dependents. Presbyterians Sharing supported renovations to make the parish more accessible, including modifying washrooms and installing ramps where there were only stairs. The Rev. Rodney Curpanen of St. Columba shared, "We are

NEW BEGINNINGS PROGRAM UPDATE

Though it may seem that things have been quiet on the New Beginnings front, we have actually moved into Phase Six of the program which is a time of discernment and decision making. Our small group facilitators have been meeting together to share their information and to discern the underlying themes and directions that came through during the small group meetings. The facilitators have gathered the comments into a report which will be shared with the congregation the last week of August to those with an email on file with the church and printed copies will be available in the office or upon request.

With that all in place, the date of **Thursday**September 29 at 7:00pm in the Sanctuary has been set for a **Congregational Information**Session. At this meeting the congregation is given an opportunity to identify priorities from within the report and affirm a future direction for the congregation. At this stage the congregation receives the report and sends it to the session to develop an action plan. Today is a day of celebration, transition, and some sadness for our sister church First Presbyterian here in Thunder Bay. The church, manse, and land on which these two buildings are situated have been sold to another congregation, Hosanna Karen Baptist Church (HKBC). celebration is that the congregation that has purchased the properties has its root at First. It was with bold ambition and great concern for the welfare of refugees from what was at the time Burma, now Myanmar, that First began to sponsor individuals and families to Thunder Bay. This work began over thirty years ago and continues through HKBC. The Karen people that were sponsored worshipped at First and, as they continued to grow, began to hold their own worship services in the church. The relationships that were forged between the peoples were filled with grace and love. It was only in the last decade that HKBC bought their own building and began worshipping elsewhere. I recall being told at the time, that it was like the children of First were all grown up and were now moving away, ready to set out on their own.

When HKBC heard that First Pres was having difficulty financially, they approached the Session and said they would be interested in purchasing the properties should they come up for sale. Which was the beginning of how we arrived at this day. All things have been put into place and the sale of the properties finalized this past week. I have likened it to the children coming back to take care of parents and grandparents. I must say that if all negotiations were as filled with grace, care, and love as this has been, the world would be a beautiful place.

So today there is a joint service of worship between First Presbyterian and Hosanna Karen Baptist Church as we formally acknowledge the transition of ownership of the property to HKBC. This does not mean the end for First. Part of the beauty of this agreement is that First will continue to worship Sunday mornings in the building they built over sixty years ago. They will continue to discern their future, but they will do it without the concern of maintaining the church, manse, and property. There will also be sadness as it means the end of what has been. The future story for First is yet to be fully determined. In the meantime, the congregation will serve God, community, and each other as faithfully as they have done for decades.

May First and HKBC know God's blessing upon them and our blessing as well. I will bring greetings from St. Andrew's as I join in this service of worship today.

SHORTBREAD SEASON
