From Joyce

Today's date is one that will be etched in minds for sometime to come. 9/11. Last year marked the 20th anniversary of the attack on the twin towers in NYC. 9/11 - Those numbers represent so much. It is a date with memories attached to it. It was a day where so many lives were permanently altered, and that day changed the way the world operated. It was a day that made those of us in North America feel and know our vulnerability. Even now, every time one enters an airport, we are subjected to rules and regulations that came out of the events of that day.

As Ken and I toured around New York City, I was surprised by the number of places that had airport-like security all as a result of the attacks. First the boat to the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. We actually had to deal with security at the base of the Statue of Liberty too, even though we had already gone through security for the boat. There was a security check point at the Empire State Building and a scaled down version of security at the Broadway show we went to. 9/11, a day that the cry for help was heard resounding across the airways.

I still remember where I was the moment I saw the first images and heard the breaking news. It was one of those kinds of days where people recognized that nothing would be the same. Now that I have been to see the memorial, it has changed the way I am experiencing this day. We walked through the park with the reflecting pools that have been installed at the base of where the twin towers once stood. The pools are cavernous. There is a feeling of awe and emptiness all at the same time. The names of those lives lost in the attack are etched in the metal around the tops of the pools. I remember our son-in -law reading to our granddaughter the name of a woman that had died with the words after it, "and her unborn chid". It was a somber moment. The depth of the pools invokes the feeling of emptiness, a void, with the water also being a sign of life-giving hope.

As we walked, we came across a tree with a story. "It was discovered amidst the wreckage of the 9/11 attacks, its bark charred from fires at the site and many of its limbs reduced to stumps. Yet somehow, the tree, still bearing leaves, showed signs of life." The tree did survive. It took much tending, it was cared for and replanted back at the 9/11 memorial, "this Survivor Tree bursts into magnificent blossom each spring, embodying a living symbol of resilience.

Out of everything that I saw in five days in NYC this tree and the pools have remained a strong image for me. It makes me think of life and death, of challenges and new beginnings, of resilience and hope. Today is once again an opportunity to remember, and reflect. To replant and to blossom. As people of faith, we embody life in Christ where God is our tree of life and living water flows.
