#### From Joyce

This week's good news has to do with the refrigerator in the St. Andrew's kitchen, the photocopier in the front office, and the gifts that people give through the Memorial and other funds.

Just before Covid hit and all things were shut down, we began having trouble with the refrigerator compressor and the fridge in the kitchen was not cooling properly. When everything in the world shut down, well we ended up shutting down our fridge as well. We knew that this machine that had served the congregation well for many years was ready for retirement. With nothing happening at the church, the Facilities and Finance team chose not to do anything about it. There was no reason to have a new refrigerator under warranty and not being used. Still the homework was done to find a suitable replacement. Once the okay was given late in the spring of this year that we could again host luncheons in Rowand Hall, the team got to work and a new refrigerator was purchased locally from Russell foods at a cost of \$4,782.16. The fridge was delivered in July. The cost was covered by money donated to the kitchen fund, another \$1,000.00 donation given specifically for the purchase of the fridge and \$1,200.00 from the Memorial Fund.

On another front, the front office photocopier was becoming obsolete and parts harder to come by. The Memorial Fund also enabled the purchase of a new photocopier. Well, it was new but a demo so we were able to get it for a good price. The copier, purchased from and now serviced by TBXI of Thunder Bay, was another \$2,938.00 but that too was able to be covered by the Memorial Fund.

All this is to say, we have been able to acquire much needed equipment for the church because of the generosity of donors and families who have this year and in previous years gifted the church with funds, through specific and memorial donations, that could be used for these kinds of purchases. It has been so important as none of this could have been paid out of our yearly church budget and for this, we are grateful.

As we continue to manage the finances of the church, with the awareness that the regular offerings/ donations of the church are lagging far behind the cost of operations, it would be a blessing to the congregation and our work if you would be able to make a special Christmas donation or consider an increase to your regular donation in order to help us make up the deficit of our current yearly budget. There is much gratitude for all that you and others do to make sure the ministry of St. Andrew's continues. We have much to anticipate and look forward to in the coming year as God works in and through us!
