From Joyce

This Sunday begins for me a month where three of the next four Sundays I will be attending congregational annual meetings. Today I start with First Presbyterian. Thank you to Rev. Pam Hogewoning for leading worship at St. Andrew's in my absence. February 12th is St. Andrew's annual meeting and February 19th I will be in Geraldton with the congregation of St. Andrew's Presbyterian and St. James Anglican Shared Ministry for their meeting.

Annual meetings are interesting as they of course deal with the finances of a congregation, but what is more important is that the annual report and the meeting itself tell of the worship, mission, and work of the congregation. It is story telling. Let me share with you a few words written by Rev. Heather Vais, a minister of the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

"Stories are important. We love to tell our stories and listen to the stories of others. Stories reveal the fabric of our lives. They share something of who we are, where we have come from and where we may be going. Jesus loved to tell stories and his stories changed lives - indeed, HIS Story changed the world! Congregations have many stories to tell - stories of mission and ministry, stories of faith and challenge, stories of faithful servants, and stories of outreach. How does a congregation tell its story of how it tells The Story?

The annual report is a document that very clearly tells the story of the life of a congregation in one year of mission and ministry. The written reports from church groups and committees provide a narrative account of the direction the church is going. These reports, in addition to the financial reports, reveal a congregation's values and mission focus. Presenting a well-written annual report can provide a significant information resource for new people wanting to learn more about the story of your congregation; it also helps members and church leaders see where the church has been and where it is going."

Let me invite you to be part of hearing and interpreting our congregation's story as you attend the annual meeting of the church. It is a time of fellowship, of celebration, of seeing God at work in our midst, and part of planning for how we will be the people of God in the coming year.
