# **PCC MISSION MOMENTS**

In many small rural communities in Ghana, lay preachers, evangelists and catechists play a crucial role. Under the direction of a district minister, who has many congregations under their care, lay leaders provide much-needed spiritual leadership. While they share a deep commitment to their call to ministry and service in the church, many have not received formal theological training.



To equip these lay leaders with helpful tools for effective ministry, the Presbyterian Church of Ghana established three Lay Training Centres (Tamale, Ramseyer and Nsaba), which receive support through Presbyterians Sharing.

# From Joyce

In ten days, it is Ash Wednesday and the start of the Lenten Season. This season is the forty days before Easter but does not count Sundays, as Sunday is always considered a "little Easter". Throughout Christian history there has been an observance of Lent, but that observance has had variances and changes over the centuries as well. If one has any knowledge of Lent they tend to understand it to be a time when you give up certain foods. The purpose of this is not to make one feel deprived but rather to add room for devotion and learning. And though often in our time we feel distracted by what we cannot have, Lent and the giving up of food was meant to be a time to free oneself of the distractions of food and to mark a time of discipline in one's life. Today we hear of people not choosing to refrain from certain foods but rather adding a piece to their lives that brings edification and maybe even puts the focus on others, such as choosing to do a devotional time or volunteering.

Lent has always been a time for quiet reflection and spiritual discipline, that is its purpose, to prepare our hearts and minds for the celebration of Easter. The Christian faith has always placed a great deal of importance on connecting with God and others. It is a faith based in relationship, and we all are aware that good relationships, strong bonds of friendship and partnerships, take time and attention. This is true of our closest friends and it is true of our church family and how we function and worship together. It is especially important when it comes to knowing and loving God. We cannot know God without spending time in praise, prayer, listening for and observing God at work in ourselves and in the world.

In the coming weeks the church will provide opportunities for you to observe this time of Lent with an Ash Wednesday service on February 22<sup>nd</sup> along with regular Sunday worship and the theme of, "Learning to Live from the Inside Out". As well there will be a midweek lunch hour service on Wednesdays lasting about twenty-five minutes, followed by a time of fellowship. Feel free to bring a bag lunch and have conversation with others after the service or just plan to attend the devotional time and head off to whatever your day has in it. May Lent be a time for you to reconnect, to reflect, and to have opportunity to observe a spiritual discipline that will bring you in a closer relationship with God and others.
