From Joyce

I have been trying to figure out how to keep everyone in the loop about what is happening with New Beginnings. The Implementation team has been meeting monthly since November but it is difficult to report the nuts and bolts of the time spent together as they are doing the team building and ground work that is necessary for other things to happen. So, though there is nothing super concrete to share with you, I still want you to be aware of the excitement that is a part of our work. The team has been working with the reports and discussions that have been a part of the entire congregation's work over the last sixteen months. Yes, it was Sept 2021 when we started into New Beginnings as a congregation, and taking time is part of what is necessary for seeking out what is emerging from all of that work. I can say that communication has become a big part of our conversations and conversations more broadly with groups in the church, which is in part why I felt the need to share something with you. There is work being done to pull together all the activity that would be considered pastoral care, from Caring and Contact, to the Visiting Ministry and Session, and a host of others in between. There will be exploration of how to keep everyone abreast of any developments. The Implementation Team and Session will be looking at the gifts that people bring and ask how you may want to be involved in what emerges. We are also looking at our online presence so that we can share more broadly what is taking place at St. Andrew's. These are really precious and exciting times for our church. May God go before us preparing our way.

PCC MISSION MOMENTS

Climate change, conflict and COVID-19 have combined to create a global food crisis where 50 million people in 45 countries suffer from acute hunger. Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D), with Canadian Foodgrains Bank and ACT Alliance, is responding in South Sudan, Pakistan, Yemen and Somaliacountries where hunger needs are worsening daily. This crisis has disproportionately adverse effects on women and girls, who make up 60% of those affected by food insecurity. Without proper nutrition, women can experience higher mortality rates for themselves and their children. With support from the church, PWS&D distributes food packages with essential nourishing items and provides families with cash assistance, helping ensure that families are fed.

SYRIA - TURKIYE EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE

The Syrian population was already deeply impacted by the ongoing war and the economic collapse of the country and now, many people must deal with being displaced, losing their livelihood and surviving the harsh winter conditions.

PWS&D is responding through our partners at <u>ACT</u> <u>Alliance</u>. MECC has offered 232 sites as shelters in Aleppo since the quake. MECC is providing mattresses and blankets, as well as hot meals, to affected families, and is working to secure additional supplies to meet the needs.

"The key need currently is food baskets," reports Ghassan Chahine of MECC. "We need canned and pre-made food, as people cannot cook at the moment." While there is a lack of availability of some key items in Aleppo, MECC is sourcing goods from Damascus.
