# From Joyce

I have been struggling of late, trying to figure out how to share with everyone the things that are being spoken about and shared, pondered and imagined as we have been going through this New Beginnings process. From the Session, to Facilities and Finance, the Implementation team and even the choir and church groups, each has had some part in the discussions that are New Beginnings. It is hard to give hard evidence that things are happening and people are at work, yet so many, if not nearly every conversation has an element of "how does this fit with New Beginnings?" There are so many ways that this congregation could potentially be in this community and partnering with others, ways that we could be emboldened and nurtured in our times of worship.

Since November the Implementation team has been working out next steps. The scope of the conversations has been so sweeping that it has taken us time to narrow down where to put energies and with whom to connect in the community to investigate those narrowed down possibilities. At this point what I feel, and might even boldly say I know, is that prayer is something that each of us can do as individuals and together so that we can discern what God is up to in our midst as we continue this work of New Beginnings. The work and joy of prayer is not for the minister to do alone, it is not even for the Session to do alone, it is the work of the community of faith. To that end, I would encourage you to pray for our church and for the ways that God will lead us. You may wish to use Ephesians 3:14-21 as the power of prayer as a community will impact the course of our ministry. I have adapted the scripture for your use on behalf of the congregation.

<sup>14</sup> For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, <sup>15</sup> from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. <sup>16</sup> I pray that, according to the riches of God's glory, God may grant that St. Andrew's may be strengthened in our inner being with power through the Holy Spirit, <sup>17</sup> and that Christ may dwell in our hearts through faith, as we are being rooted and grounded in love. <sup>18</sup> I pray that St. Andrew's may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, <sup>19</sup> and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that we may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Now to God who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, <sup>21</sup>to God be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever.
