From Joyce

As anyone who reads this column would be aware I spent the last week on study leave. As I write this, I have completed part one of the study leave, which was a few days at a quiet/silent retreat at the Anglican Convent for the Sisterhood of St. John the Divine in Toronto and entered into part two which is the Lester Randall Preaching Conference, also in Toronto. Last week I shared what the theme was for the Preaching Conference, but little about the retreat. Well, that was because I only planned the retreat around the conference itself. The retreat was something to fill in the time. Besides, I had done a couple of other retreats at the convent a number of years ago, so I knew that whatever it was I would learn something. But with ministry being pretty full I hadn't really paid attention to the retreat portion other than to know that it was entitled, *Our Spiritual Autobiography*, and that sounded interesting. Well, it turns out I had signed up for a writer's retreat. Again, not a bad thing when one is trying to become more intent about journaling, and also not a bad thing when you are a preacher. Any writing tips and learning are helpful. Turns out the facilitator of the retreat was the author of a book that had been required reading for me at seminary. Some of you will find the title amusing, *Never Call Them Jerks*, by Arthur Boers. This time he was using his recently published memoir, *Shattered*, as the model for his teaching.

Why I had really signed up for the retreat was to spend time in quiet. Even meals are eaten without conversation. You don't speak to people in the corridors, bathrooms, or public areas. The Sisters say that they offer a hospitality of silence. Of course, conversation is a part of the workshops, but that happens in one room. As soon as you walk out of that room silence is expected. The silence allows for different things for different people, but for many it seems to act like a reset, which is part of what I experienced. Not surprisingly there is learning in times of quiet. One learns something about themselves, but in my case, I also had the bonus of learning some writing techniques that I will experiment with. I give thanks again, for the opportunity to set aside time for learning whether it be in the stillness of a convent or the hustle and bustle of a preaching conference.
