October is such an interesting month. We celebrate World Communion Sunday, Thanksgiving, and Halloween as major moments, but until I became a member of Diversity Thunder Bay, I didn't realize how many other celebrations and observances take place in the month of October. To name a few in a very abbreviated format...

Latin American Heritage Month: In 2018, the Parliament of Canada proclaimed October Latin American Heritage Month in recognition of the Latin American community's tremendous contribution to Canadian society.

National Disability Employment Awareness Month: National Disability Employment Awareness Month, held in October, was established to increase awareness of the positive outcomes of hiring persons with disabilities in Canada.

Canadian Islamic History Month: Canadian Islamic History Month is an observance held annually in October to recognize and celebrate the rich contributions of Muslim Canadians to the fabric of Canadian society.

German Heritage Month: Canadian German Heritage Month is a celebration held annually in October to honor and recognize the significant contributions of Canadians of German descent to the cultural, social, economic, and political fabric of Canada.

Being a woman in a position that was not long ago only afforded to men, the following got my attention. **Women's History Month:** October is Women's History Month in Canada, a time to celebrate the women and girls from our past, and our present, who are contributing to a better, more inclusive Canada. In 1992, the Government of Canada designated October as Women's History Month, marking the beginning of an annual celebration of the outstanding achievements of women and girls throughout Canada's history. This year's theme, **Through Her Lens: Celebrating the Diversity of Women**, emphasizes the importance of recognizing the achievements and contributions of women from diverse backgrounds. It focuses on the unique perspectives, experiences, and challenges faced by Indigenous women; women from 2SLGBTQI+ communities; and newcomer, racialized, and migrant women. Let's continue to honor women who don't accept the status quo and fight hard to improve the lives of all women in the country.

The first woman ordained to word and sacrament in the Presbyterian Church was Shirley Jeffreys on May 26, 1968. May we continue to recognize the ways that women impact for good the many areas of arts, science, medicine, research, sports, religion, politics, family, health and well-being and more around the globe.
