Though it has been a couple of weeks since the preaching conference I attended, I still have pieces that are sitting with me. The title of the conference was Amazing Grace. The first hymn of the event was Amazing Grace. Now I will tell you that Amazing Grace has not been one of my favourite hymns for sometime, but in this setting, a setting of hope and anticipation I felt a little shift. Those words were presented to us in word, prayer, and song. I thought about it as I reflected on my own ministry and especially St. Andrew's, but also First Presbyterian, St. Andrew's and St. James Shared Ministry in Geraldton. I thought about how we can share the amazing and generous grace of God with our city. I considered how much I pray and hope that grace will overflow from our church communities to others. I thought about how I desired to have grace enfold me so that all that comes to me and all that goes from me is the grace of God from and toward others. I experienced grace as I shared a sermon with a small group who held me in grace and shared insights about my preaching in a space of grace.

It is always the hope of organizers of such a conference that people will go away having experienced something of benefit, in this case for our preaching and ministry, and I was not disappointed. You will likely find that this theme of grace permeates my sermons for a time. Having said that, it already has been. The sermon I chose to share with my colleagues was from September 24 of this year and the title was Generous Grace. This conference deepened and affirmed my understanding.

As the conference closed, the final hymn was again Amazing Grace. I sang it, this time with tears and thanksgiving. I give thanks for the amazing grace of God in my life and know that God's amazing and generous grace is the reality for each of us each day, even when we are not aware. May our lives be an example of the breath of God's grace in the world.
