HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN GAZA

As Palestine and Israel are mired in violence and suffering, PWS&D is prepared to respond to the humanitarian needs. The ongoing hostilities have created a humanitarian crisis, with homes, schools, medical facilities and crucial infrastructure having been extensively damaged or destroyed. The conflict has led to a significant mass displacement—1.4 million out of Gaza's 2.2 million residents are currently displaced.

The Presbyterian Church in Canada (PCC) stands in solidarity with all the people of the region. With the church leaders in the area, the PCC condemns all acts that target civilians, regardless of nationality, ethnicity, or faith.

PWS&D supports peacebuilding efforts in Israel/
Palestine through KAIROS' Women of
Courage program. PWS&D's humanitarian
response will assist with shelter, food, livelihoods,
emergency health, psychosocial and mental health
support, as well as cash assistance to allow people
to purchase the goods they require.
