

# From Joyce

I have been trying to figure out what welcome means to different people. I have seen the welcome that some have received from our congregation. It is warm and welcoming. Everything from the greeting at the door to being handed a bulletin during the service if for some reason a guest does not have one. I have watched as people have been invited to sit with another so that they can be guided through the worship service and not feel alone, which can be especially important in this large space that we call the sanctuary. And as I shared last week, I have appreciated when I go down for a lunch or coffee hour and find that guests have someone sitting with them and engaged in conversation.

Yet, I have also heard stories of people who have come into our sanctuary and not felt greeted or welcomed at all. I am not sure where the gap lies. I wonder if what is welcome to one does not feel like welcome to another, some people needing more conversation, and some wanting to be left alone, not wanting to engage, and it is difficult for us to figure that out. If we see someone already speaking to a guest, rather than offering our own welcome, even if it is a quick welcome, we think that it better not to overwhelm people by inundating them with another conversation.

I will say I don't have an answer, which is why I started out by asking, "What does welcome mean to different people.?" I also wonder about a broader question that is about welcome through social media and our online worship services as well as welcoming community throughout the week. This is one of the questions the Session is and will be grappling with. I would love to hear different perspectives and even hear from you should you wish to be a part of a team that works together to answer this question the best way we can figure out to do. May we live into the works, Responding, Restoring, and Rejoicing, as we look to how we welcome people in a way that sees them as they need to be seen and loved as God calls us to love.


