Time for a New Beginnings update for those of you who were not able to be at the Annual meeting back on February 11th. Part of what came out of the work of New Beginnings was the desire to connect with community to partner with groups, organizations, or the like in the community and to be able to welcome the community in to use the space that we have at St. Andrew's, as this building is our largest physical asset. In order to do that well, it had been determined by the Implementation Team, Session, and the Facilities and Finance Team that making our church fully accessible would be important. With much foresight those in leadership in past years along with the congregation raised the funds for the elevator and placed the ramp at the front entrance, the doors are also wide enough to accommodate various needs. Yet without proper washrooms and accessibility buttons at the ramp entrance we could not claim that our building was fully accessible.

That is changing. The Facilities and Finance Team has been successful in being approved for several grants. Most of the grants have come from available Ontario anti-hate security and prevention grants. We also received one accessibility grant that we managed to get in on before the program was discontinued. These grants have allowed us to increase safety around the church with a more secure back entry, an audio/visual security system, the accessibility buttons to open the doors at the ramp entrance so that people can access the building with ease, as well as allowing staff and volunteers to manage entry to the building through the security system. That work is all complete. What is being worked on now is the construction of four gender-neutral bathrooms where we now have the women's and men's washrooms in the hallway. Two of the four washrooms will be fully accessible. Architectural drawings are being reviewed and once complete then permits will be applied for. The hope is that all will be in place so construction can take place during the summer when the building has less activity. This is very exciting for us as a congregation as we seek to realize the hopes of the New Beginnings work.
