

This coming week I will be in Toronto for four days attending a New Beginnings training event. Now I am not attending in order to be trained. That might come another day, but right now there is enough going on here, so I am not taking on anything more. I have been invited to attend the event because our congregation is one that is considered to have gone through the New Beginnings program and achieved desired outcomes of the program. It is not that our work is done, but rather that we have gone through the process with most of the congregation engaged in some way, having an implementation team that continued the work, and that the work is still continuing through the Session and really the whole congregation. You see for many congregations they may not have had as many people involved in the New Beginnings work itself or they get stuck. They do some of the work as long as they have a coach, but when the coach's time is done then things get dropped and the work does not continue. That is not the case for St. Andrew's. In fact, whether or not you as a congregation are aware, there has been a major culture shift at St. Andrew's. No longer do we hear people spending time reminiscing so much about the past, other than to relate it to how we will move into our future. I have often heard at meetings the question, "So how does this fit into our New Beginnings work?" or "Maybe we need to rethink or reimagine things since we are in a time of transition and things *can* change!"

As for the training event, myself and another minister from Stouffville have been asked to attend in order to provide valuable insights and feedback to those being trained based on our own experiences going through the New Beginnings program with our congregations. I will say, the only reason I get this opportunity is because this congregation has done the work. I get to represent all of us. I am so proud of St. Andrew's! We have so much more to do, but there is also so much hope and energy around the changes that are being made and what is yet to be done. I am honoured to be a part of this ministry and to carry you with me, sharing what we have accomplished together while knowing that we are still in transition. Given the way things change at an unprecedented rate in the world, transition will become our norm, but that is no longer something to fear, but rather to be embraced. Thank you for being a congregation willing to discern God's will for us as we work and worship from our corner of Donald and Brodie streets.
