I have so many thoughts on my mind that to focus on one seems difficult. So, I thought I would share a few of the ruminations of my mind. The first is that I recognized this week that how I lead this congregation is evolving and it is truly an answer to prayer. In the last few months, I have seen over and over again how that is happening in a new way. Leadership is coming from those who are working on our fall event that used to be called the bazaar and shortbread sales. There are those working with me to look at the shape of worship and those who got together for studies without my leadership. There are some determined and focused minds that are working on a fall wellness workshop as well as ideas coming forth for fundraising, one of which looks like it may include a spectacular Christmas Concert. There are people contributing through their gifts and expertise from crafts and lessons for special children and youth Sundays to a company with ties to St. Andrew's sharing their knowledge around communication for our benefit. And the Facilities and Finance team, which has always been a strong team, continues to deepen in trust and leadership, particularly as we work to bring the building inline with the hope for the use of the building and ideas that are borne out of the New Beginnings program. As well, our leadership team, which is called the Session in our Presbyterian way of doing things, has been steadfast in their support of the changes that we see happening and being the strong foundation for everything that has taken place over the last ten years.

In terms of how that influences the way I provide leadership, well, I am having to learn to let go and trust that I don't need to know how everything is being taken care of. It is important to be looped in, but I no longer have to be so "hands on" with everything. Again, this is what I have been hoping for, just that now it is here it kind of took me by surprise! Lol! So maybe that is where I will leave this, with thanksgiving for the way God is at work in our midst as a congregation and through teams and individuals.

I am so proud of this congregation that I let everyone I meet know that I have the best leadership and the most wonderful congregation anywhere. Do we have work to do, difficult decisions to make, and a huge challenge financially, yup! We do! But I have never been more sure that God is not done with us yet. Still, we have to continually be paying attention to God at work in, through, and with us. So, I guess I would ask one more thing of all of you. Please hold this congregation in prayer. We have a lot happening, much of it behind the scenes as the foundational work is happening, but I feel strongly that prayer is what will lead us to the best decisions that reflect what God is calling us to. Your prayers will lead us to understand and discern what the Holy Spirit is doing in our midst so that we can love and care for others in a multitude of ways, while bringing beauty and wholeness to individuals, to the community, and to our worship and work. Praise God from whom all blessings flow.
