From Joyce

I don't often write about financial things, not because they are not important, but because people can have all sorts of reactions where money talk is involved. Still, it is a reality that any organization cannot function without financial support. It is also a reality that though the church is super important to many people the congregation does not have the financial stability that is needed to do ministry. Every month there is a shortfall for our budgeted expenses. There are also projects that we need to do to make our building accessible and others that are necessary for the upkeep of the building.

We have planned for washroom renovations to be done this summer. We are doing this work in order to live into our vision for the use of the building, the biggest and most expensive asset this congregation has. Through the work of the New Beginnings Program, the congregation as a whole came to determine that finding ways to partner in and with community was our future story. To live into that future story means to take some risks in planning and following through with some projects prior to inviting others to use our building. These projects also benefit our own congregation's use. One of those projects is to make the building fully accessible and provide a safe space for people to meet, this includes security cameras, monitors and accessibility projects. Much work has been done through the Ontario Anti-Hate Security and Prevention grants we have received. We also received a Government of Canada Accessibility grant which allowed for the ramp entrance doors to have a button push that allows people to enter without barrier when needed. Some of the money from both of those grants is going into the washroom renovations, but it is not enough to cover all the expenses. One of the bequests we received will help cover this cost, still any money we take from the bequest is less money for other projects, and truthfully, we are at times having to take from that pool of money in order to cover the regular expenses of utilities, wages, building insurance, and more...expenses that we had hoped would be met by the regular donations of our members. We have also learned that there is much work to be done to restore the outside wood frames on the upper-level stained glass windows as the wood around these has deteriorated due to regular exposure to the elements.

I am not writing to cause alarm but rather an awareness that your regular and special contributions make a huge difference to the well being of the congregation and the ministry we are undertaking and hope to engage in. There is so much passion and energy in this congregation. There are feelings of great hope and anticipation for what is next. There are people in the congregation, from the leadership teams of the Session and Facilities and Finance to various individuals, doing the ground work that it takes to fulfill our desire to be the people of God. People that are able to respond to needs in the community, restore people to wholeness in their lives, and to rejoice together with them and each other. Financial donations, are one part of the equation, but a necessary part. It is always the prayer of the congregation through the approval of the budget and the approval of projects that all that is needed will be available to the congregation for it's work.
