ROMANS FOR EVERYONE

Using N.T. Wrigh's Romans for Everyone, Part 1, Chapters 1-8 20th Anniversary Edition with Study Guide we will be exploring the first chapters of Romans. N. T. Wright is the Chair in New Testament and Early Christianity at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. He is the former Bishop of Durham in the Church of England and is a prolific author and noted New Testament scholar. Writing in an approachable and anecdotal style, Tom Wright helps us see the great sweep of this letter. Romans has long been viewed as the book above all in which Paul puts forth the basic doctrines of the faith, and the picture of God's life for us. It is the classic setting-out of the Gospel.

This study will begin in October with day and time to be determined. You can order the book yourself or ask Rev. Joyce to help you secure a copy of the book. This is shaping up to be an interesting time of learning, discussions and connecting. If you have been looking for a way to engage with scripture and glean new insights this is an place for you.



From Joyce

I'm back! Last Sunday was my first Sunday in the pulpit after five weeks away and I didn't realize until I was into the worship service just how ready I was and how excited I am to get to work. The weeks of vacation allowed me to step away from my responsibilities and I really took the time to enjoy family and friends. Ken and I also managed to put on over ten thousand kilometers in the process, which is nuts when you think about it, but it allowed us to be with people we love and who have been a part of our lives while still being able to use our RV and have some quiet down time.

Now that we are back a few things are happening at the church. Plans are underway for a Holistic Wellness Workshop on Saturday October 5th and we have five speakers lined up to take participants through an awesome day focusing on wellness. Registration opens this week!

The popular and well attended Music Classes for preschool children will be starting the last week of September but registrations will be opening up in the next couple of weeks.

The next group gatherings for discussions on things of faith will begin in October. The book we will be looking at is *Romans for Everyone* by N.T. Wright.

You can also mark your calendars for a St. Andrew's Event on Friday November 15th. More to come on that, but it will include the pick-up day for Shortbread and displays of Nativity sets in the Sanctuary. That also means that if you can pick up butter on sale for the making of shortbread or are willing to help with making shortbread in October and November that would be so helpful and valuable. Annually we have fundraised about \$8,000 through shortbread sales, which is so important as we meet our goals for ministry and care of the church. As well, if you have a nativity set to offer as part of the Nativity display, we would be pleased to have you lend it to the church for that event.

The big project on the go this summer is the bathroom renovations. Demolition has begun and the plumbing and electrical will be happening next. When all is said and done St. Andrew's will have four gender neutral washrooms in the main hallway. One of those washrooms will also be fully accessible. This is a major project coming in at a cost of between \$55,000 – \$60,000. We have received grants of just over \$19,000. If you would like to help offset the costs of this project with a donation that would be amazing! You can donate online, by etransfer or at the church. The reason for this project at this time is to help us move into our future story coming out of New Beginnings, a story of partnering in community and with community. To be able to do that well, becoming a fully accessible building was accessed to be a need which included changing our washroom spaces. With this project we also need to bring that part of the building up to Ontario building code standards. The gender-neutral washrooms will also help us create a safe space for anyone using the building.

This is an exciting time for St. Andrew's!
