ROMANS FOR EVERYONE

Using N.T. Wrigh's Romans for Everyone, Part 1, Chapters 1- 8 20th Anniversary Edition with Study Guide we will be exploring the first chapters of Romans. N. T. Wright is the Chair in New Testament and Early Christianity at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. He is the former Bishop of Durham in the Church of England and is a prolific author and noted New Testament scholar. Writing in an approachable and anecdotal style, Tom Wright helps us see the great sweep of this letter. Romans has long been viewed as the book above all in which Paul puts forth the basic doctrines of the faith, and the picture of God's life for us. It is the classic setting-out of the Gospel.

This study will begin in October with day and time to be determined. You can order the book yourself or ask Rev. Joyce to help you secure a copy of the book. This is shaping up to be an interesting time of learning, discussions and connecting. If you have been looking for a way to engage with scripture and glean new insights this is an place for you.

Things continue to progress with the bathroom renovation project. We have gone from demolition to the beginnings of reconstruction. The rough in plumbing is complete, new plywood has gone down on the floors, the framings of walls is pretty well complete, and fire rated drywall on the ceiling is installed.

It was so interesting to see how the building was originally constructed with lathe and plaster as well as major steel beams that are a testament to why this building continues to stand with beauty and integrity after 115 years. There were also moments of nostalgia as the dumb waiter that had been closed off for many years was completely removed to make room for a modern and large accessible washroom. I had heard many stories about that cabled cupboard that had allowed for the movement of food and dishes from floor to floor throughout the years and that, after it became obsolete, youth had used it for their own entertainment. Hence why it had been nailed shut!

As you might imagine this project has been messy, as demolitions tend to be, so please excuse the dust for now. Removing the lathe and plaster was a big job and the dust sneaked out of the enclosed area regardless of the attempts to seal in the area. Once the drywall has been taped and mudded Sheila, our custodian, will have her work cut out for her as she moves through the building to clean up the layers that have accumulated.

This is a major project that is helping us move into being able to call ourselves a fully accessible building. This is part of the vision the congregation has as we move into ways of connecting with community. Though we received \$19,000.00 in funding through grants, the rest of the funding for this major project is coming from savings.
