ROMANS FOR EVERYONE

Using N.T. Wrigh's Romans for Everyone, Part 1, Chapters 1- 8 20th Anniversary Edition with Study Guide we will be exploring the first chapters of Romans. N. T. Wright is the Chair in New Testament and Early Christianity at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. He is the former Bishop of Durham in the Church of England and is a prolific author and noted New Testament scholar. Writing in an approachable and anecdotal style, Tom Wright helps us see the great sweep of this letter. Romans has long been viewed as the book above all in which Paul puts forth the basic doctrines of the faith, and the picture of God's life for us. It is the classic setting -out of the Gospel.

This study will begin in October with day and time to be determined. You can order the book yourself or ask Rev. Joyce to help you secure a copy of the book. This is shaping up to be an interesting time of learning, discussions and connecting. If you have been looking for a way to engage with scripture and glean new insights this is an place for you.

From Joyce

Let me highlight Sunday September 29th. The Sunday is geared toward families in worship and will be a wonderful time of learning for all. It lands the day before September 30 which marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. "The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process... Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30." *

"Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations." *

We have the privilege of having Ash Moreau with us as an Indigenous drummer and also to teach us about bundles. This to go with the blessing of backpacks for those entering or returning to school or headed to posted secondary education. We also include children who are headed to childcare. That Sunday morning, we will bless the students and families. So, for those who are back in school, bring your backpacks with you! We also encourage the wearing of orange shirts as we acknowledge the history and ongoing impacts of residential schools and the reconciliation process while hoping that we can be a part of the healing.
