Pam is a minister of the Presbyterian Church in Canada who lives in the Thunder Bay area. She is dynamic and a joy. It is always a great experience to worship with someone else leading, as a different person can bring new perspectives and learning. So I encourage you to come and worship together with her on October 27th.

Sunday November 3rd I am back in the pulpit. November 3rd is a very special Sunday at St. Andrew's. It is known in the Christian Church as All Saints Sunday. At this worship service we take time to remember those who have been apart of our congregation or for whom I have led a service of remembrance that have passed away in the last year. A candle is lit and the name spoken of each of those people. There is also an opportunity given for anyone to light a candle in memory of loved ones.
