With support from Presbyterians Sharing,
Hummingbird Ministries promotes healing for Indigenous generations, addressing the trauma of a colonial past while nurturing hopes for a brighter future. Led by the Rev. Mary Fontaine, the first Indigenous moderator of The Presbyterian Church in Canada, the ministry fosters healing and reconciliation through cultural arts, including dance and drama performances. Additionally,
Hummingbird Ministries connects with congregations across the PCC to provide healing through workshops and events like National Indigenous Peoples Day, the Christmas Circle, and the Peace through the Arts Festival.

Mission Moments are short highlights of the mission and ministry that we are doing together in Canada and around the world through Presbyterians Sharing and PWS&D.

Wow! Now sure how I feel about seeing 2025 all over the place now. Even though it is a little overwhelming to think that we have gotten through another year – way

too quickly! – and a new year has begun, one thing I feel is gratitude. St. Andrew's has been a place of hope and welcome. I am excited for what 2025 holds for this congregation. I know it will hold heartbreak as members deal with the challenges and hardships that none of us escape in this life, but I also look forward to what God will be doing in, with, and through us. Thank you for being who you are as a congregation, for your grace given to me and to each other. May I be able to serve you as you need in this time and place at St. Andrew's.
