This week the Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. Though I think more people attend Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Tuesday dinners than likely above the Ash Wednesday consider it may be

show up at an Ash Wednesday service, it may be that this year you would consider the Wednesday night service. Ash Wednesday is a beautiful and sacred way to begin this season. This service starts our preparation as we consider the depth of meaning of God coming to earth in the body of Jesus. It is why Christmas and Easter are the big celebrations in the church. These are celebrations of God come to us as "God with us". First God coming in the baby and then God giving us hope and promise of new life right now through the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus.

It seems easy to celebrate the birth of a child, and so Christmas gets a lot of attention, as it should. This was the inbreaking of God into our everyday lives, living among us, experiencing life as we do and yet doing it in a way that brought healing, teaching, grace, mercy, and compassion. Yet it was in Jesus' death and rising to life again that this healing, teaching, grace, mercy, and compassion continue to transform our lives each day.

Lent is an opportunity to go deep and consider more fully, and once again, how all of this can change us and breathe life into every day. Breathing life into every relationship, guiding how we walk in the world in every moment, helping us to live more intentionally while bringing love and goodness into the world, not through our own reason and determination, but as a response to the amazing and deep love of God for us.

So, eat pancakes on Tuesday and then come and start this journey of Lent on Ash Wednesday at the 7:00pm service. Or take time on your own to honour this first day of Lent. On Sunday March 9th there will be a service of communion and each Sunday in Lent we will be looking at passages from the letter to the Romans. In preparation you may wish to read Romans starting at chapter 8 and going to the end. Make this Lenten season one to grow in depth and understanding of God and in relationship with God.

Josseling, an extroverted and enthusiastic 16year-old, is committed and eager to get ahead. Beginning at 5 a.m., she and her mother have a stall selling fruits and vegetables at the Roberto Huembes Market in Nicaragua. Josseling attended entrepreneurship workshops run by Prebyterian World Service & Development's partner, which helped her establish her successful market stall. One of Josseling's key principles is that "no one can leave the stand without buying," so she carefully considers her customers' budgets, asks about their specific needs, and adjusts the ingredients accordingly. This way, they can afford their purchases and will likely return to her for their next market visit. In addition to her market job, Josseling attends school, where she is currently a senior and dreams of becoming a doctor.
