It is not news to anyone that St. Andrew's has seen change, and a lot of it over the years. Even during my tenure here, I have witnessed changes in the numbers and make up of Elders on the Session, leadership has changed with Lunch with a Difference, and this past week at the Mid-week Lenten service, the faces of those who for years attended and valued this time of reflection are no longer there. And though we all find change difficult, it is happening whether or not we like it. But change is not all bad. Most of what we don't like about change is that it means relationships change. In terms of the church it may mean that we have people who can no longer take on roles that they once had, their energy is waning, even if their minds and spirits desire to still contribute as they once did.

This has been on my mind as the St. Aidan's Guild voted to close the Guild in February of this year. At one time this congregation had the lona Guild, The Evening Guild, St. Aidan's Guild, and The Seekers. There may have been other women's group that I have missed in this list, I am not really sure. Still, each of these groups have done much of the bedrock work of fundraising and providing a place for women to forge close and caring friendship circles. Theses groups have spent countless hours helping the church function in seen and unseen ways. The Seekers are the only group that remains and you will see that they continue the long history of providing opportunities for fellowship for not just their group but for the church. They are the ones spearheading the Flea Market this year and the proceeds from that will be given to a local mission. As the congregation continues its work of fundraising, with a new Fundraising Team, we know that we can count on the support of this group to help with many of these opportunities.

As for St. Aidan's, they are not disappearing completely and for that we are thankful. St. Aidan's has for the last few years been operating a catering group that has consistently served the luncheons when there were funeral services at the church. As well, those who are able in the group, are happy to be called on to support the endeavours of other groups and functions in the church. We will celebrate the legacy of St. Aidan's at our worship service on Sunday March 23rd when the group is hosting a coffee hour after worship.

Things are changing, but it doesn't mean that our work is done. We have other teams that are now taking on new challenges. These teams are either in a development stage, just gaining their momentum, or are now in a second cycle of preparations. If you are interested in being a part of the work and fun, please contact me and I will point you in the right direction based on how you want to participate in the life and work of the congregation. The Seekers and St. Aidan's Catering are also more than happy to welcome new people to their work and fellowship. There are also the three teams that are either organized or getting organized. These three groups are part of the redevelopment that comes out of our work of the last four years with the New Beginnings program.

These are exciting and changing times for St. Andrew's, and God is with us, in it, inspiring, creating, as we respond, restore, and rejoice!
