From Joyce

This past week I have been at what is called the Clerk's Consultation for the Presbyterian Church in Canada (PCC). One of our Elders, Fred Dewsberry, was also present for the event. I was there as the Clerk of the Synod of Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario and Fred as Clerk of the Presbytery of Superior. This consultation takes place once every years. Clerks do a number of the two administrative tasks for their respective working groups. Our church also has a Clerk of the Session, who is Darlene Niemi-Lehto. This particular consultation is geared to the Synods and Presbytery Clerks. Our job descriptions start with being minute takers, but we are also consultants as we become the ones who find the answers to many of the procedural questions that can come up with the work of being and doing church. The work of a clerk often goes beyond the job description given when we take on the task of being clerk, and the things we are called on to do vary with the needs and transitions in any given Synod or Presbytery. The consultation is an opportunity for learning together, sharing concerns, and connecting with the PCC's national office staff who are often our first call when we need guidance. It is also an opportunity to network and find support with each other in the work that we do. It is not glamorous work or even work that most people are even aware is happening, but it is important work as clerks are connectors, communicators, and aid in the ongoing work of beina the church, not only as individual congregations, but as part of the whole that is the Presbyterian Church in Canada.
