#### From Joyce

Not everyone is on our mailing list for the Sunday worship video, which also provides the newsletter and a shortened version of the worship service in print, so you may not have noticed that I have not been as active online in the last while as I have been over the last five years. Still, as this online ministry is part of our whole ministry, I thought I would catch everyone up on a change that is taking place with online worship.

Prior to Covid this church did not have much of an online presence. As with many congregations, that event in history changed how we connected with our members and those who happened to learn about the online ministry of St. Andrew's. At the time I made the decisions about how we would present our services, I chose to think of you sitting with me having a conversation, though a rather one -sided conversation. I hoped that it would be more personal as you sat in front of your screen to feel like I was speaking directly to you rather than an empty sanctuary.

Once we were back worshiping together in the sanctuary, I continued with the same format as we did not have the technical capability of either equipment or expertise to create a quality experience for live streaming worship, plus I kind of liked the idea that it was just me and you. Now some five years out from 2020 I am rethinking our online ministry. *New Beginnings*, which was the program that St. Andrew's participated in from 2021-2023, is still an ongoing work with us in that we are continually being curious about things we have been doing and what will best fit what we are endeavouring to become as we seek to discern what God is already doing in the community and in our church.

So, I have been pondering online worship. Though these videos are fairly short in length, usually just under thirty minutes, the time to put the video together is much longer, especially when considering what it takes for the choir or a soloist to record a hymn. Much time in the week has also been allocated for the administrative assistant to put all the pieces together and upload the video to the YouTube platform. Then there was me. The ability to meet the deadline for all the pieces to be put together has at times put a lot of pressure on me, especially in weeks where other ministry demands had to take precedence. To that end, I am changing things up. I will provide a video of just the sermon most weeks. When I am away for study leave or vacation there will be no video or print version of the service.

I am prayerful about this change. There are new narratives of hope and possibility that are emerging at St. Andrew's and I desire that volunteers, staff, and myself have the space for the creative energy and time that will be needed for us to do this new work well. This change for online worship is part of creating that space. As always, I look for feedback, ideas, and encouragement as we continue in our work as families and friends in worship and work. May God add a blessing as we look to God for our way forward so that we can respond to the needs in community, restore people to wholeness, and rejoice in what God is doing with, through, and in us and others.

### **MISSION MOMENT**

After contracting polio in her youth, Akelwela Adanladi was left with physical disabilities. As subsistence farmers, her parents could not afford to send her to school. Her life changed at 30 when she was identified by the Community-Based Rehabilitation program of the Presbyterian Church in Ghana. Through the program, she obtained a cloth weaving apprenticeship and access to start-up capital for her business. Now a trainer, Akelwela empowers young people through skills training. "I am able to generate enough money to meet my needs and I am so grateful to the CBR program for coming to my aid. Today, I have a beautiful life."
