MISSION MOMENT



With support from Presbyterians Sharing, the Joint Christian Committee for Social Service offers an

Electronics/Computer training program in the Sabra/Shatilla Palestinian refugee camp in the southern part of Beirut, Lebanon. Established in 1962, a one-year certificate program of computer assembling and maintenance incorporates both theory and hands-on practical experience.

Teachers try to simplify the material and make it interesting for students who often have only an intermediate level of prior education. A popular recent addition to the program is the repair of cellular phones. Equipping young people with skills and vocations that allow them to enter the workforce quickly, thus generating income to support themselves and their families, is especially essential in refugee communities.

Mission Moments are short highlights of the mission and ministry in Canada and around the world supported by Presbyterians Sharing, and Presbyterian World Service & Development.
