# From Joyce

As this is the last newsletter for 2025 it seems a good time to reflect on the year that was, and look to the year ahead.

As I look back, not only at this year but what has been happening in this church for the last

few years, I can't help but feel pride and gratitude for this congregation. Particularly in this last year I have seen people come together for the sake of the church and their love for community in new ways. Teams of people are learning how to work seamlessly together and are finding joy in their work. And that is key for me. When you are doing something for God and for the church, for family and for community, it hopefully brings a sense of joy, of having accomplished something together, even if it took a lot of time, effort, and relationship building.

And seeing these relationships that are being developed is something that I have enjoyed most, and has brought me hope as well. #### MISSION MOMENT

Pakistan is listed among the world's worstperforming countries in education indicators. Poverty, child labour, gender discrimination and harmful norms within a highly patriarchal society impede equal access to education, particularly for girls. In response, Presbyterian World Service & Development is implementing a school feeding project with its partner in Pakistan to encourage girls' school attendance in marginalized communities in Umerkot. Meena, a participant in the program, shares that receiving a goat as part of the School Feeding Project has become about much more than just an animal—it is a symbol of her family's commitment to education and community well-being. "Providing milk to the school is my responsibility, and I take pride in doing it because I know it benefits not just my daughter but all the children in our village. Their health and future matter to me." she shares.
